After water was shut off to 26 homes, Jean and his crew worked until 11:30pm battling multiple hole cave-ins due to the high groundwater situation. The next day Jean placed a call to EJP's 24 Hour Emergency Number. Ted Amaral and Bill Miller responded within 10 minutes. Both men showed up at the site with the specified parts after John Lucarelli & Sons Excavating finally exposed the break. Unfortunately, according to Jean Marcotte: "what was on the map was not what was in the ground." Another call was placed to Ted who met Jean at the shop within twenty minutes to provide the proper parts to complete the repair. Despite all the problems, Jean was quick to point out that the delay in restoring water service would have been much worse "had Team EJP not stepped up to the plate." # Round Lake makes history with Merritt Construction...

Team EJP Round Lake's Purchasing Department is calling the Rondout Interceptor – Inverted Siphon Project "one of the largest HDPE Fusion Projects ever sold in the state of New York." As Ted Amaral of Team EJP Round Lake explains: "the project involves directional boring of two holes under the city of Saugerties, NY, and pulling through 3,000 feet of 18" as well as16,000 feet of 16"(HDPE) High Density Polyethylene Pipe that are joined together using special fusion machines.



Time was of the essence for Team EJP Mashpee on September 29, 2004. In order to successfully string pipe for The Town of Mashpee, MA, a busy road had to be shut down and the town provided Team EJP Mashpee with a delivery window between 8am and 1pm. Working with PEP Transportation, Team EJP Mashpee delivered 14 loads of ductile iron pipe and 3 loads of fittings which Bottolotti Construction installed on time.
