Mechanic Falls Water Dept. River Crossing

Dear Team EJP,

At the Mechanic Falls Water Department we had a dilemma on our hands. We had a river crossing that was installed in 1894 that had developed a leak so it had to be shut off. We had applied for SRF money, but opted not to borrow the needed \$228,180 (plus interest) to replace the pipe with new ball and socket river crossing pipe. To compound the problem the existing pipe went under the old fire station addition and the service to the building was now in the garage.

After a few conversations with Don Alexander from EJP, and some input from Ray Morang, Team EJP Service Tech, it was decided that it would be possible to slip a new 8"HDPE pipe through the old cast iron. A team from EJP fused the pipe together, over 500' in all.



Longchamps and Son from Lisbon were hired to perform the work. In no time they were ready to pull the new line through. Both ends were connected to piping that was less than 12 years old. Even though we ended up with 8" pipe instead of 12" pipe we feel that the loss was minimal because of the smooth bore plastic versus the rough interior of the old unlined pit cast iron.

There were some tense moments while we were pulling the pipe through. But in the end it came off without a hitch. At present we are still waiting for all the bills to come in, but all indications are that we will be in the \$40,000 range. Thanks to the "can do" attitude of Team EJP our dilemma was solved with a substantial saving to the town.

Town of Falmouth, MA

Waterfront Properties Protected From Wind and Wave Erosion

The scope of this environmental project consisted of repairing three water front properties on East Harbor Drive in East Falmouth, MA. These properties abut the salt water inlet of the Dexter River off Great Pond Harbor. They were all affected by severe scouring of the slope toe with significant loss of trees and vegetation. This resulted in extensive erosion of each property.



To overcome the erosion problems, a combination of 12" and 20" - 9lb knotless net coir fiber logs (totaling approximately 1500 feet of product) was stacked up the slope up to a height of six feet. This barrier protects the slope from wave and wind action. Coir matt was laid down on the upper slope which was revegitated with various plantings to protect it from further rain and wind erosion. To create a seamless install, the coir fiber logs were all stitched together with a high strength nylon string.









Hillsboro Hydrant Change

Tom Fishero with the Town of Hillsboro, Indiana, has been changing out all his old fire hydrants and replacing them with new AFC Pacer and Trend fire hydrants. With nearly 95% completion, Tom used AFC valves to insure the best products for the task.

Tom has said that due to all the great features of AFC hydrants and valves, it was apparent that he made the right choice. Team EJP Lafayette kept Tom informed on the correct locking fittings to enforce the design to prevent blow-off. Hillsboro residents may rest assured that they have been protected for future fires and should thank Tom for making the right choices.

St. Leon, IN-Installs Galvanized Gabions

In Chad Edward's territory there is a small town off SR 1 called St. Leon, Indiana. St. Leon is very hilly and this has historically caused severe erosion control problems due to run-off. The Indiana D.O.T. decided that the best way to tackle this problem was to install Galvanized Gabions with an 8oz. Non-Woven filter fabric underneath.

Where Gobblers Knob and Wewe Hill Rd. (it's true) meet, they decided to install the Gabions that feed into a 96" elliptical pipe. Steve Bischoff from Paul H. Rohe Inc. contacted Team EJP W. Indianapolis Branch to purchase the products needed for this job. Mr. Bishcoff had never installed Gabions and Team EJP W. Indianapolis had the answers to all of his questions.

In March of this year they had hired Lou Townsend who has 19 years experience in the erosion control - geosynthetics industry and has completed numerous Gabion jobs throughout his career.

To make a long story short, with the assistance of Team EJP West Indy, Paul H. Rohe Inc. was able to complete a 24' wide x 120' long channel that was finished 10 days ahead of schedule.



Hudson Valley Waterworks Fall Conference

Harriman, NY—On November 18, for the second year in a row, the Hudson Valley Waterworks Association partnered with Team E. J. Prescott to host its annual fall seminar. The event drew in excess of 100 participants, including professional engineers, waste water operators and water operators. 

All participants received certificates of completion, and water operators, waste water operators and professional engineers all earned professional development hours toward recertification.
